WHAT ASSIGNABLE REALLY MEANS

Use this section as a practical conversation guide, self-evaluation tool and next-game plan.

Reliable You accept only what you can work, arrive early and communicate changes immediately.	Prepared You know the level, rules, site, partners and current points of emphasis.
Consistent Your judgment and professionalism travel from gym to gym.	Crew-centered Partners feel supported because you communicate, stay in your primary and help with certainty.
Low-maintenance You solve routine issues calmly and do not create unnecessary work for the assigner.	

An assigner is placing trust—not simply filling a slot.

YOUR REPUTATION IS BUILT OFF THE COURT

Availability Keep calendars accurate. Decline promptly instead of holding assignments you may abandon.	Communication Use concise, professional messages. Confirm unusual details and report emergencies early.
Appearance Wear the required uniform correctly and maintain equipment that looks game-ready.	Punctuality Plan for traffic, parking and site access. “On time” means ready for the pregame.
Digital conduct Assume public posts can reach coaches, schools, assigners and partners.	

People remember how much uncertainty followed your name.

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TRUST ON THE COURT

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Primary discipline Cover your matchups and use a patient cadence when helping outside your area.	Game awareness Know clock, score, fouls, possession arrow, timeouts and special situations.
Communication Use approved signals and brief explanations supported by what you actually saw.	Composure Maintain professional body language through pressure, mistakes and disagreement.
Consistency Apply the same legality and advantage-disadvantage standard at both ends.	

Trust grows when your crew can predict your preparation and your standard.

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A 30-DAY REPUTATION RESET

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Week 1 Audit availability, response time, arrival habits, uniform and social profiles.	Week 2 Ask two trusted partners what makes you easy—or difficult—to work with.
Week 3 Choose one mechanics habit and one communication habit to improve on film.	Week 4 Send a concise update to your assigner: availability, development work and goals.
Ongoing Keep a private assignment log with partners, feedback and follow-up actions.
